## **APSF Patient Safety Activities**

The APSF has provided 130 anesthesiologists more than \$13.5 million in funding for anesthesia patient safety research. Examples of the success associated with APSF-supported research include: Hypothermia, Perioperative Vision Loss, Simulation, and Residual Neuromuscular Blockade.

Our translation of the *APSF Newsletter* into five languages has dramatically increased readership. In 2020 the *APSF Newsletter* and the APSF website had over **2 million page views** from all 230 of the world's countries. Arabic and Russian translations will be added in 2022.
